




Q2 Type of TPC grant your agency currently receives: (*Indicator 16-"Tobacco Free Families" is not a required indicator)



Q3 Have you conducted an in-person or virtual Breathe Training or Breathe Refresher this grant year (July 2020-June 2021)?




Q4 How many Breathe Trainings have you conducted this grant year?




Q12 How useful has the Breathe website (justbreathein.org) been to you this grant year?




Q13 How useful has the Breathe Facebook group been to you this grant year?
